Boise Veterans Home News

Census: Skilled Nursing - 71; Residential - 16

We are now a 5 Star Facility! The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) is the regulatory body which sets forth and surveys hospitals and skilled nursing facilities for compliance to regulations. Facilities are given a "star rating" from 1 to 5 stars depending on their results in: Survey Results, Staffing Numbers, and Quality Measures.

Six years ago, the Boise home was a 1-star facility due to the survey in January 2016 in which we were issued an Immediate Jeopardy citation. Over the past several years, we have worked diligently to maintain compliance with state and federal regulations, as well as monitoring our staffing numbers and quality measures. Most recently, our survey which concluded on December 3, 2021 resulted in only three minor citations. That survey has now been uploaded into the CMS Five Star system and we are now a **FIVE STAR FACILITY!!** For more information check out this link: <u>5 Star Rating</u>

2022 Veterans Parade: The parade committee suggested changing the route to include the VA Hospital and Boise Veterans Home. The VA gave it their stamp of approval. Now it will be taken up with the ACHD and Boise City.

New Hires: We hired a Staff Screener, an Infection Protocol Nurse, a temporary PRN RN Sr., and Dietary Aide Senior. *Our biggest need* and challenge continue to be staffing the dietary department as well as the evening and NOC shifts for both CNAs and Nurses.

As of 4/21/2022 The community transmission levels are at moderate (yellow) for Ada, Canyon, and Elmore counties. IVAL hosted their quarterly meeting and approved funding for several projects at the Idaho State Veterans Home to include the following:

Putting Green Update: Several newsletters ago – I mentioned that we were working to finish the putting green by putting in knee walls and other improvements. Because of the pending construction for the new Boise Veterans Home, those plans were cancelled. Instead, based on the recommendation from Jay Romlein (AL #113) and Boise Parks and Recreation, we will install xeriscape in the form of a "Pollinator Garden." IVAL has agreed to fund the purchase of plants and ground cover.

Shade Cloths for SCU (Special Care Unit) Several trees were removed due to bore damage leaving very little shade for residents sitting outside. With plans to replace the Boise Veterans Home, it did not make sense to replace them. Instead we will be installing shade cloths at strategic locations.



When we needed someone to help us develop our Library Program, she researched, developed and implemented the "Homebound Services" book delivery from the Boise Municipal Library — which our voracious readers enjoy tremendously! She and her husband Jon (also a volunteer) came in when we were short staffed and helped pass meal trays on the units — the staff enjoyed their help so much they began to request them by name!

Vicki is originally from Butte, Mt. and is a Montana State Bobcat! Vicki came to Boise to visit for the summer, landed a job with the city, and stayed 39 years! She was a single mom for nine years, raised two daughters and then met Jon, who wore her down and convinced her that she should marry him.

We also share Vicki with three grandchildren so if the canteen is closed Thursday afternoons, it's because she's doing grandparent duty! She loves to travel and excels at finding the best fares and then fills her remaining time with cooking.

I asked Vicki why she chose the Boise Veterans Home to volunteer? She shared that she had neighbors who were both veterans and when she passed, her neighbor became a resident at the Veterans home. "I saw the need for visiting and I would come visit her a lot." "After I retired, I decided to volunteer!"

When I asked Vicki about a favorite memory, she mentioned that "one resident would come to the canteen and have me get her three doughnuts, and two cappuccinos and hide them in her wheelchair saddle bags so she could get them by the nurses station!" Ayi, yi, some things, as volunteer coordinator, I do not want to hear!

Moving on to the next question - Vicki acknowledged that because of her volunteering, she has "more empathy for seniors." "You see people and you think, why are they here and you hear what they went through and what their life was like on the outside. And if my being here makes
