- Looking to increase transportation programs for veterans in the state, specifically disabled veterans across the state
- Secondary hopes are to divest the wheelchair program IDVS currently manages and transfer it to ITD

2. 4th Veterans Home

- Proposed site in Post Falls includes 7 lots w/ 5 lots to be donated by the land owner.
- Dependent on the size of the facility, the 2 northern lots will either need to be donated or purchased, as these 2 lots may be necessary in meeting the acreage needs of the project.
- Analyzing many different bed size scenarios (48-bed, 64-bed, 70-bed, 80-bed, 84-bed and 96-bed facility)
- Based on current projections- State would need to supplement the operations
- Numbers reflect that the facility would not be selfsufficient due to the cost to operate this small home (CLC) living concept
- Due Diligence & Accuracy Check- Contracting with Professional Consultant to review Financial Plan
- Directing our attention to a 64-bed facility.
- The VA per Diem and Medicaid reimbursement for a new nursing home is not received until the facility is surveyed and certified.
- The Medicaid rate for new nursing home is lower for first three years until level of care is established and not received until facility is surveyed.
- The VA is changing procedures of contracting with private nursing homes; making it easier for private nursing homes to contract with VA for caring for veterans.
- The number of SNF (Skilled Nursing Facility) beds has been declining steadily in Idaho for 10 years now. Even with 5 new facilities. Most new SNFs are exclusively short term rehab. The baby boomers prefer ALFs (Assisted Living Facility) to SNFs. The number of ALFs has exploded in 10 years.
- Currently there are 79 SNFs & 286 ALFs in Idaho
- Nursing facilities projected occupancy levels in the surrounding Northern Idaho area to be less. Although our occupancy rate average 90-92% compared to 65% for all Idaho facilities, in region 1 the occupancy in 2014 was 61% and in 2015 it was down to 59%.
- Our ranking will be near the bottom of the priority list. Therefore, it may be at least a 5 year waiting period,
